Lindsay Baker,Julie Philips Baker,1996 I never talk to nobody bout this was the response of one aged African American when asked by a Works Project Administration field worker to share memories of his life in slavery and after emancipation He and other ex slaves were uncomfortable with the memories of a time when black and white lives were interwoven through human bondage Yet the WPA field workers overcame the old people s reticence and American West scholars T Lindsay Baker and Julie P Baker have
