

A brief summary of some of the most important maths concepts to be taught in Year 4

1. Choose appropriate methods

This section is concerned with getting children to make decisions about:

Which operation is involved in word problems

Whether calculations should be done mentally or with pen and paper.

How to explain and record the operations used in solving the problem.

Our worksheets focus on examples and draw children's attention to these issues, but it is important to realise that these decisions should be taken by children in most things they do in mathematics, so encourage them to discuss their work wherever possible.

They should be able to make up number stories about calculations; in other words, make up their own problems.

Here is an example of how **not** to do it!

Teacher: 'Paul, tell me a story about the sum $16 + 5 = 21$ '

Paul: 'Two rabbits were walking down the road. One said to the other "What's sixteen add five?". The other rabbit said "That's easy, twenty-one".'

The teacher was expecting something along the lines: 'Mary had sixteen stamps. She bought another five. Now she had **21** altogether'.

Another example of a number story: Sarah has **85p** pocket money each week. In four weeks she receives **340p** or **£3.40**.

Children should also be able to deduce an operation in a sum.

e.g. In the sum $24 * 5 = 120$, the $*$ stands for multiplication.

Lastly, they should be able to study the subtraction of different pairs of numbers and state and justify which is the easiest and which is the hardest to do. This really makes them think about the operation of subtraction.
