Kisak, 2017-05-29 At the time of this publication at least 9 countries own and operate approximately 15 000 nuclear weapons Russia and The United States control approximately 93% of these which is roughly 13 500 nuclear weapons Approximately 2000 are kept in the ready to launch mode The remainder of the nuclear stockpile is owned by France China UK India Israel and the latest threat of Iran and North Korea On a positive note according to The Ploughshares Fund <http://www.ploughshares.org> world nuclear stockpile report more countries have given up weapons and programs in the past 30 years than those that have tried to acquire them The estimated high count of Nuclear Weapons was 70 300 in 1986 which represents an approximate 78% decrease It must be noted that the exact numbers of nuclear weapons are national secrets and these numbers therefore represent estimates by experts in their field These weapons are land based aboard ships and submarines mounted or carried on aircraft and probably soon to be developed for spacecraft The threat of nuclear weapons and nuclear war is not often discussed in a public forum The reason is most likely that the outcome from the use of these weapons is unacceptable unfathomable and somewhat of an action of last resort and the world has reached a tipping point where the continued proliferation acquisition and possession of nuclear weapons must be eliminated The outcome of a nuclear war of any size is counterproductive and an insult to our common
