

HOW TO WRITE AN ESSAY INTRODUCTION

DEFINITION

Writing an essay introduction involves capturing the reader's attention and providing background information about the topic. It should provide a clear and concise thesis statement, outlining the main points to be discussed in the essay. A strong essay introduction sets the tone for the essay and provides a roadmap for the reader to follow.

EXAMPLE

1. Start with a hook that captures the reader's attention, such as a surprising statistic or a relevant quote.
2. Provide background information on the topic, explaining its significance and relevance.
3. Clearly state the thesis statement, outlining the main points that will be discussed in the essay.
