## **Studio System:**

Hollywood TV Christopher Anderson, 2013-10-11 The 1950s was one of the most turbulent periods in the history of motion pictures and television. During the decade as Hollywood's most powerful studios and independent producers shifted into TV production, TV replaced film as America's principal postwar culture industry. This pioneering study offers the first thorough exploration of the movie industry's shaping role in the development of television and its narrative forms. Drawing on the archives of Warner Bros and David O Selznick Productions and on interviews with participants in both industries, Christopher Anderson demonstrates how the episodic telefilm series, a clear descendant of the feature film, became and has remained the dominant narrative form in prime time TV. This research suggests that the postwar motion picture industry was less an empire on the verge of ruin, as common wisdom has it, than one struggling under unsettling conditions to redefine its frontiers. Beyond the obvious contribution to film and television studies, these findings add an important chapter to the study of American popular culture of the postwar period.

The Hollywood Studio System Douglas Gomery, 2017-10-27 Despite being one of the biggest industries in the United States, indeed the World, the internal workings of the dream factory that is Hollywood is little understood outside the business. The Hollywood Studio System: A History is the first book to describe and analyse the complete development, classic operation and reinvention of the global corporate entities which produce and distribute most of the films we watch. Starting in 1920, Adolph Zukor, Head of Paramount Pictures, over the decade of the 1920s helped to fashion Hollywood into a vertically integrated system, a set of economic innovations which was firmly in place by 1930. For the next three decades, the movie industry in the United States and the rest of the world operated by according to these principles. Cultural, social and economic changes ensured the demise of this system after the Second World War. A new way to run Hollywood was required. Beginning in 1962, Lew Wasserman of Universal Studios emerged as the key innovator in creating a second studio system. He realized that creating a global media conglomerate was more important than simply being vertically integrated. Gomery's history tells the story of a tale of two systems, using primary materials from a score of archives across the United States as well as a close reading of both the business and trade press of the time. Together with a range of photographs never before published, the book also features over 150 box features illuminating aspects of the business.

Studio Ghibli Rayna Denison, 2023-02-21 Studio Ghibli: An Industrial History takes us deep into the production world of the animation studio co-founded by Oscar-winning director Hayao Miyazaki. It investigates the production culture at Studio Ghibli and considers how the studio has become one of the world's most famous animation houses. The book breaks with the usual methods for studying Miyazaki and Ghibli's films, going beyond textual analysis to unpack the myths that have grown up around the studio during its long history. It looks back at over 35 years of filmmaking by Miyazaki and other Ghibli directors, reconsidering the studio's reputation for egalitarianism and feminism, re-examining its relationship to the art of cel and CG animation, investigating Studio Ghibli's work outside of feature filmmaking, from advertising to

videogames and tackling the studio's difficulties in finding new generations of directors to follow in the footsteps of Miyazaki and Isao Takahata. By reconstructing the history of Studio Ghibli through its own records, promotional documents, and staff interviews, *Studio Ghibli: An Industrial History* offers a new perspective not just on Ghibli but on the industrial history of Japanese animation.

In *The Hollywood Trust: Trade Associations and the Rise of the Studio System*, Kia Afra provides a detailed account of three successive trade organizations from 1915 to 1928: the Motion Picture Board of Trade, the National Association of the Motion Picture Industry (NAMPI), and the Motion Picture Producers and Distributors of America (MPPDA). Afra outlines the relationships of power in Hollywood's early years, asking questions such as: How and why did the studio system come about, and what were the industrial and institutional forces that impacted Hollywood's development? In order to answer these crucial questions, *The Hollywood Trust* explores the role played by film industry trade associations in navigating important issues facing the burgeoning studio system, including censorship, public relations, trade practices, government regulation, film distribution, labor conflicts, taxes, and tariffs, and exhibitor opposition. A vital look at an under-reported aspect of the studio system, this volume fills a gap in the history of the American film industry. As such, *The Hollywood Trust* will be of particular interest to scholars of film history, as well as those concerned with cultural history and the political economics of entertainment.

Movies based on literary works, while often billed as adaptations, are more correctly termed translations. A director and his actors translate the story from the written page into a visual presentation. Depending on the form of the original text and the chosen method of translation, certain inherent

Willis,1928 Indians in Unexpected Places Philip Joseph Deloria,2004 Despite the passage of time our vision of Native Americans remains locked up within powerful stereotypes That s why some images of Indians can be so unexpected and disorienting What is Geronimo doing sitting in a Cadillac Why is an Indian woman in beaded buckskin sitting under a salon hairdryer Such images startle and challenge our outdated visions even as the latter continue to dominate relations between Native and non Native Americans Philip Deloria explores this cultural discordance to show how stereotypes and Indian experiences have competed for ascendancy in the wake of the military conquest of Native America and the nation s subsequent embrace of Native authenticity Rewriting the story of the national encounter with modernity Deloria provides revealing accounts of Indians doing unexpected things singing opera driving cars acting in Hollywood in ways that suggest new directions for American Indian history Focusing on the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries a time when according to most standard American narratives Indian people almost dropped out of history itself Deloria argues that a great many Indians engaged the very same forces of modernization that were leading non Indians to reevaluate their own understandings of themselves and their society He examines longstanding stereotypes of Indians as invariably violent suggesting that even as such views continued in American popular culture they were also transformed by the violence at Wounded Knee He tells how Indians came to represent themselves in Wild West shows and Hollywood films and also examines sports music and even Indian people s use of the automobile an ironic counterpoint to today s highways teeming with Dakota pick ups and Cherokee sport utility vehicles Throughout Deloria shows us anomalies that resist pigeonholing and force us to rethink familiar expectations Whether considering the Hollywood films of James Young Deer or the Hall of Fame baseball career of pitcher Charles Albert Bender he persuasively demonstrates that a significant number of Indian people engaged in modernity and helped shape its anxieties and its textures at the very moment they were being defined as primitive These secret histories Deloria suggests compel us to reconsider our own current expectations about what Indian people should be how they should act and even what they should look like More important he shows how such seemingly harmless even if unconscious expectations contribute to the racism and injustice that still haunt the experience of many Native American people today Transactions of the Society of Motion Picture Engineers Society of Motion Picture and Television Engineers,1919
