categories good effective discipline and bad ineffective discipline Phillips Weiner and Haring explain that good discipline is not a matter of punishment or a brutal attitude It emphasizes the development of a structure which is conducive to the child s learning achieving and developing emotional and social maturity They posit that good discipline in schools helps to promote self discipline as a habitual way of behaving Self discipline contributes to self assurance and thus affects one s outlook and confidence and as such it is conducive to learning On the other hand they refer to bad discipline as discipline that is too harsh too quickly administered and too defeating Haring Weiner and Phillips 1960 Close and prolonged observation within many public and private schools at both primary and secondary levels would perhaps reveal varying interlacing of both good and bad discipline systems Few would argue that maintaining good discipline is a necessary prerequisite to establishing a school or classroom climate that is conducive to learning This belief is conceded to by Curving and Mendler Setting Limits in the Classroom, 3rd Edition Robert J.
