Our War Too Margaret Paton-Walsh, 2002. In the late 1930s, a number of American women, especially those allied with various peace and isolationist groups, protested against the nation's entry into World War II. While their story is fairly well known, Margaret Paton-Walsh reveals a far less familiar story of women who fervently felt that American intervention was absolutely necessary.
