


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web hydrogen fuel energy uses the most important industrial method for the production of hydrogen is the catalytic steam hydrocarbon process in which gaseous or vaporized hydrocarbons are treated with steam at high pressure over a nickel catalyst at 650 950 c to produce carbon oxides and hydrogen  $2\text{C}_n\text{H}_{2n} + 2\text{H}_2\text{O} \rightarrow 2\text{C}_n\text{O} + 2\text{H}_2$

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web hydrogen demand reached 94 million tonnes mt in 2021 recovering to above pre pandemic levels 91 mt in 2019 and containing energy equal to about 2.5 of global final energy consumption most of the increase came from traditional uses in

refining and industry though demand for new applications grew to about 40 thousand tonnes up

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web a key barrier for low carbon hydrogen is the cost gap with hydrogen from unabated fossil fuels at present producing hydrogen from fossil fuels is the cheapest option in most parts of the world depending on regional gas prices the levelised cost of hydrogen production from natural gas ranges from usd 0 5 to usd 1 7 per kilogramme kg
